Morning departure to Versailles for a visit of Palace and its gardens. The Palace of Versailles was the principal residence of the French kings from the time of Louis XIV to Louis XVI. Embellished by several generations of architects, sculptors, decorators and landscape architects, it provided Europe with a model of the ideal royal residence for over a century. In the afternoon we will move to Palace and Park of Fontainebleau to explore what kings of France from the 12th century were using, the medieval royal hunting lodge of Fontainebleau, standing at the heart of a vast forest in the Ile-de-France, which was transformed, enlarged and embellished in the 16th century by François I, who wanted to make a 'New Rome' of it. Surrounded by an immense park, the Italianate palace combines Renaissance and French artistic traditions. Meals: B

Day 03 : Avignon – Arles - Avignon

Morning visit of Capital of the Christendom in the Middle Ages - Avignon kept of its history, a heritage of exception, a big part, of which is registered on the UNESCO world heritage list: the Popes' Palace and the Bridge of Avignon, but also the square of the palace with the baroque facade of the hotel of currencies, museum of the Petit Palais and the cathedral of Doms, as well as the ramparts since the garden of Doms up to the Bridge. Continue to what once was a metropolis of Roman Gaul, then Arles became a symbol of ardent Christianity as can be seen through the arena, the Alyscamps burial grounds, the amphitheater and the Roman baths of Constantin.

Day 04 : Avignon - Lyon

Morning departure to Pont du Gard (Roman Aqueduct), built shortly before the Christian era to allow the aqueduct of Nîmes (which is almost 50 km long) to cross the Gard river. The Roman architects and hydraulic engineers who designed this bridge, which stands almost 50 m high and is on three levels – the longest measuring 275 m – created a technical as well as



an artistic masterpiece. Continue to Alpes region and its central city - Lyon with its charming and beautiful streets, the old part of town overlooking from the hill Fourviere, boasting a landscape of UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Day 05 : Lyon – Loire Valley – Tours

Morning departure to Loire Valley for a visit of very distinctive French Renaissance architecture of Château de Chambord which blends traditional French medieval forms with classical Renaissance structures. The building, which was never completed, was constructed by King Francis I of France. Continue to Château de Chenonceau Known as "Château de Femmes" or "the castle of six ladies" for the succession of powerful French noblewomen of Chenonceau, who each made an impact on the castle, forming it into the lovely château we see today. This enchanting castle may be smaller in comparison to others, but what it lacks in size it makes up in charm. "This truly is a magnificent place, deeply rich with history, and is certainly one of... the most romantic Châteaus in Loire Valley." The tour will continue in Tours also called »Le Jardin de la France«. There are several parks located within the city. The buildings of Tours are white with blue slate (called Ardoise) roofs. Tours is famous for its original medieval district, called le Vieux Tours. Unique to the Old City are its preserved half-timbered buildings and la Place Plumereau, a square with busy pubs and restaurants, its many bridges crossing the river Loire. One of them. Near the cathedral, in the garden of the ancient Palais des Archevêques (now Musée des Beaux-Arts), is a huge cedar tree planted by Napoleon.

Day 06 : Tours – Mont Saint Michel – Paris

After breakfast departure to one of France's most recognizable landmarks, Mont Saint-Michel and its bay which are part of the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites to enjoy the spectacular sight. 

- Brussels: City that has so much more to offer then just chocolates and beer. Not to be missed are Grand Place, the Manneken Pis, Palais de Justice and Opera house, the Royal Palace, and the east side of the city where the modern structures of the European Union are.
- Antwerpen: Belgium's second city and biggest port, in the mid-16th century it had been one of Europe's most important cities and home to baroque superstar artist Pieter Paul Rubens, as you'll be so constantly reminded. 



Morning sightseeing tour of Tirana, the capital of Albania which enjoys a beautiful setting between the ranges of Daiti Mountains from one side and the coastal plains on the other one. We will see Skenderbeg square, Palace of culture and visit the National Museum. While still in Albania we will visit Kruie which rises 560 meters above sea level on the slopes of Sari - Salltiku Mountain. Visit the Museum of Skenderbeg, housed within the medieval castle where you will learn the history of Albania's national hero who led the 15th century struggle against the Ottoman Empire. The final destination of the day is Podgorica, the capital of Montenegro. Meals: B, D

Day 05: From Podgorica to Budva

After the short orientation tour of the modern

Day 06: from Budva to Dubrovnik

The first stop on today's journey is the Bay of Kotor, the deepest fjoprd in Southern Europe. Afterwards proceed to Coatia and its Pearl of the Adriatic, Dubrovnik.

South of it, there is the Bishops Palace where the Abbatial Treasury of St. Marco is held today with its rich collection of the Croatian and Italian Renaissance art works, the collection of manuscripts and books, and a collection of the ceremonial clothes. From the Cathedral Square we will descend to the north tower, Zakrjan. In the first street on the right, there is the family house of the traveller Marco Polo. who was born here in Korcula, and died in Venice. The family house of the Polos in Venice vanished and was replaced by a theatre, whereas Korcula has preserved his family house in memory of the great Marco. In the afternoon cross back to the mainland and after a short stop in Neum, the coastal town of Bosnia and Herzegovina, arrive to Split. Meals: B, D

Day 09: From Split to Šibenik

This morning our goal is to explore the massive palace built by the 4th century Roman emperor Diocletian as his retirement home which is also on the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. We see Jupiter's Temple, the Peristyle and the Cathedral as well as Split's many Renaissance and Gothic structures. Over time the city has encroached into the corners and crannies of the palace; shopkeepers and tiny restaurants now make their home within its massive walls. Then it is of via Trooir, the center of artistic activities to Krka National Park. Here you will take a stroll

through part of this park and view some of the unique Karst formations during your boat ride on green and clear Krka river. Late afternoon arrival to Šibenik

Day 10: From Šibenik to Plitvice

The little streets, the attractive squares are remarkable and the stylish architecture of the vanished centuries is still evident in the buildings of the city. One of the main attractions that you will visit is the Cathedral of Sveti Jakov, which was built in 1434 and is listed by Unesco World Heritage. Mid morning departure to the best known national park of Croatia, Plitvice. This afternoon, we explore the breathtaking scenery of this natural wonder of 16 terraced lakes surrounded by thickly wooded mountains and lush vegetation. Each of the falls is at a different elevation and feeds into the next through a series of spectacular cascades and frothing waterfalls. Meals: B. D.

Day 11: From Plitvice to Opatija

The whole morning is dedicated to explore Plitvice, UNESCO World Heritage site and have your camera ready while strolling around several of the upper lakes. Day 01: Tirana

Arrive at Tirana airport and transfer to your hotel. In the evening meet your fellow travelers for dinner scheduled in one of the local restaurants. Meals: B. D.

Day 02: Tirana

Morning departure to Kruje which rises 560 meters above sea level on the slopes of Sari - Salltiku Mountain. The city is surrounded by walls reinforced by nine towers which served as observation and signaling posts during times of war. Visit the Museum of Skenderbeg, housed within the medieval castle where you will learn the history of Albania's national hero who led the 15th century struggle against the Ottoman Empire; the Ethnographic Museum will be visited during our tour as well. There will be time to explore the old bazaar before returning to Tirana. Meals: B

Day 03: From Tirana to Apollonia and Vlore

Morning sightseeing tour of Tirana, the capital of Albania which enjoys a beautiful setting between the ranges of Dajti Mountains from one side and the coastal plains on the other one. We will see Skenderbeg square, Palace of culture and visit the National Museum. Late morning departure to Apolonia, situated 12 km from the city of Fier. Apollonian was founded by the Greek colonists who came from Corinth. In Roman times Apollonian was a flourishing city near the Aos river. We will visit its monuments and museum and proceed to Vlore for an overnight.

Day 04: From Vlore via Butrinti to Saranda

Morning drive to Butrinti to visit this archeological site which is on the UNESCO World Heritage List since it bears witness to the continuous inhabitance since prehistoric times. Butrinti has been a Roman city, a bishopric, and enjoyed the prosperity under Byzantine administration. It was briefly under the Venetian rule and then abandoned in the late Middle Ages after marshes formed in the area. The present archaeological site is a repository of ruins representing each period in the city's development. We will visit Temple of Aesculapius, the Baptistery, and the Nympheum. Meals: B, D



Day 05: From Saranda via Gjirokaster to Korce

Breakfast and departure to Gjirokaster, the "Stone City", situated on the eastern slope of Mountain Mali i Gjere and which is on the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites due to its architectural peculiarities. The city dates probably from the 4th century and passed to the Turks in the 15th century. What strikes visitors the most are the typical and characteristic houses which resemble little fortresses, clustered one above the other. During the sightseeing of Gjirocaster we will visit the Weapon Museum and the fortress. Later we proceed to Korce for an overnight. Meals: B, D

Day 06: From Korce to Ohrid

This morning we depart for Ohrid, but our first stop will be to visit St. Naum, the renovated monastery complex dating back to the 10th century. The monastery and the church were built by the end of the 9th century by St. Naum as a station and healing center for pilgrims. In the afternoon, we will reach Ohrid where several monuments will be seen during our sightseeing tour: the monument of St. Cyril and Methodius, the Lower gate, Samoils fortress, Ohrid market and the church of St. Sofia with its icon museum.

Day 07: From Ohrid to Skopje

This afternoon, we will reach Skopje, the capital of Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, now an independent state. City sightseeing of Skopje features the Old Railway Station – the first train station in the Balkans, the Monument of Mother Teresa, the church St. Spas, built at the end of the XVII century and the Stone Bridge – a monumental structure in the center of the city. This evening join your fellow travelers and the Tour Director for a farewell dinner.

Day 08: Skopje

Your tour finishes after breakfast in Skopje and transfer to Skopje airport. Meals: B







Day 03: from Sofia to Rila Monastery and Plovdiv

We visit Harastrau Park and enjoy a guided stroll through the open-air Folk Village Museum. The rest of the afternoon is free. Meals: B

Day 08: From Bucharest via Sinaia and Bran to Brasov

The possibility of payment could be also agreed with the contract between the client and PROMET T&T.

Our bank information is always cited on every pro-forma or invoice. Otherwise please ask for the bank information by contact phone or e-mail.

Payment can be made by a bank transfer or by a bank cheque. Both the receiving side and the sending side cover the bank charges of their banks. In case of payment with credit card the surcharge of 3% for transfer costs will be applied.

CANCELLATION FEES:

The total rooming reservation can be cancelled up to 45 days before the arrival. After the 35th day, the cancellation fees will be as follows:

SIGHTSEEINGS:

ROOMING LIST:

A preliminary rooming list is required 35 days before the arrival. A final rooming list is required 14 days before the arrival.

CLAIMS:

Any claim has to be communicated to our agency during the stay or within a maximum of 7 days after end of arrangement with the agency. No claim will be accepted afterwards. All claims should be sent in written form to the agency.

LEGAL JURISDICTION:

Negotiation is considered a general method of solving problems or discrepancies concerning the fulfilment of the contract. In case that the results of such negotiations are not found satisfactory by either of the parties, courts in the Slovenia are considered the courts of appeal and arbitration.

OTHERS:

For some bookings, special conditions can be negotiated. In that case, the special conditions replace these general conditions.

Groups will operate only when minimum 20 people are confirmed. Otherwise the offer, realisation and rates are on request.
